

Page ID Displayed in Header

Beginning July 5, 2011 CM/ECF will begin displaying document headers differently. Below is a comparison of the way the headers displayed before and the way they will display as of July 5, 2011. The reason for this change is so the Page ID number can be added to the header.

What is the Page ID number?

The Page ID number is a unique identifier that is assigned to each page of each document and/or exhibit that is filed. The Page ID numbers are sequenced in the order in which the documents are filed in a case. If a user prints a set of documents, each page of the selected documents will display the same unique page number each time it is printed or viewed. This will ensure that anyone accessing the document, whether an internal court employee or a member of the public, will always reference the same page.

Searching for a Page ID or Document

In addition to the Page ID being added to the document header, there is a new search feature added to the Docket Sheet Report screen. After entering a case number, If the Page ID is known, the page can be searched for directly from the docket sheet report screen. If the document number is known, this may also be searched for.
