GIGLIO DISCLOSURE CONCERNING MOHAMED AL-DANI

1. The U.S. Government agreed to transport Al-Dani and his family to the United States and to provide asylum for them. The U.S. Government provided Al-Dani and his family with new identities and supporting documentation.

2. Al-Dani currently receives from the U.S. government a monthly annuity payment. This is a lifetime annuity that provides a cost-of-living adjustment of 2.5% annually and a surviving spouse benefit of 50%. From 1999 through May 2010, Al-Dani has received \$329,613.38 in annuity payments.

3. Al-Dani received a stipend of \$10,000 per year from February 2000 to February 2010. This stipend included an annual 2.5% cost-of-living adjustment.

4. The U.S. Government has reimbursed Al-Dani for certain medical costs for himself and his family. From 1999 through May 2010, the U.S. Government reimbursed Al-Dani \$221,008.41 for health insurance premiums and related medical expenses. The U.S. Government will continue to provide Al-Dani with up to \$30,000 per year for health insurance premiums and related medical expenses until 2019.

5. From 1999 through May 2010, the U.S. Government has provided Al-Dani \$64,087.41 in reimbursement for educational expenses for himself and his family.

6. The U.S. Government provided Al-Dani with a one-time payment of \$250,000.

7. In addition to financial aid, the U.S. Government provided or made available formal and informal advice and referrals concerning locations in which to settle, employment options, educational opportunities, and family and personal counseling.

8. The U.S. Government assisted in gaining college admissions for two of Al-Dani's children.
