1. <u>Nature of Motion.</u> Pursuant to Rule for Courts-Martial (RCM) 906(b)(7), the government moves the Court to compel defense submission of page 56 matters.

2. Summary of Facts

- a. The case of U.S. v. SSgt Lopez was originally docketed for trial on 31 May 2011 with the submission of page 56 matters due on the 11 May 2011.
- b. On 13 May 2011 defense filed a motion to continue which was granted until 3 August 2011.
- c. A 39(a) session was held on 19 July 2011 to litigate the defense motion to compel the production of 56 witnesses. At the 39(a) session the government moved to have a date set for the submission of page 56 matters. The military judge set 26 July 2011 as the deadline for submission of page 56 matters.
- d. On 25 July 2011 defense submitted an unopposed extension request for the submission of page 56 matters. This request was denied.
- e. To date the government has not received the defense witness list, defense request for instructions, or the defense exhibit list.

3. Discussion

The Court should compel the defense to submit Page 56 matters. The prosecution is hampered in its ability to prepare for trial. Without knowledge of the witnesses the defense is requesting the government cannot arrange for travel.

4. Evidence and Burden of Proof.

- b. <u>Burden of Proof</u>. The government carries the burden of persuasion by a preponderance standard.
- 5. <u>Relief Requested</u>. The Government respectfully moves the Court to compel the defense to comply with the military judge's order to submit page 56 matters.
- 6. **Oral Argument.** If deemed necessary, the government respectfully requests oral argument.
