2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Okay. Well --

3 CAPTAIN ROWE: Do you see what I'm saying?

4 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah, I know I do.

5 CAPTAIN ROWE: See why your view of it scares me,
6 what I remember.

7 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I mean, I'm trying to talk about

8 CAPTAIN ROWE: I care -- I care a lot about you, but
9 can you do me a favor?

10 LIEUTENANT KLAY: What's that?

11 CAPTAIN ROWE: Don't blame me fully. I can't be the
12 only thing that's wrong with your life. There's no way.

13 LIEUTENANT KLAY: It's not. You're definitely not
14 only thing.

15 CAPTAIN ROWE: I was -- I was -- we've been friends
16 for a year. You know, six days ago it's been a year.

17 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I don't know. I feel like it was
18 forced thing. I felt like if I didn't do that, I was going to
19 be humiliated in front of the command and my husband.

20 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. I would never say that because
21 listen to this. And this is why I would never say that. You
22 may have heard it, whatever. I could never -- think about

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1 How could I ever tell on you?

2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: How could you what?

3 CAPTAIN ROWE: How could I have ever told on you? I
4 would never even threaten to tell anyone. I can't, because
5 if I were to say, okay, I'm going to tell on her.

6 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Well, I think you were just made.
7 think you were just angry. I don't know.

8 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. You're smart. You're as smart
9 I am, and you know that I can't tell on you because all you
10 would say is, oh, I've been sleeping with him all year. How
11 could I tell on you, because I would just be telling on

12 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Just because Suzanne --

13 CAPTAIN ROWE: I could never even --

14 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Just because Suzanne used that
15 tactic doesn't mean that I used that tactic, and it doesn't
16 matter about like what you're motive was. You said that. You
17 said I'm going to tell the command and tell you, and then
18 wanted to leave..

19 CAPTAIN ROWE: No, he didn't even know that.

20 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Jeremy was like -- you remember.

21 was like, Jim, let's get out of here. Jim, let's go. And you
22 kept being like, no. Jeremy get up here, blah, blah, blah,

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1 saying mean things about me and stuff. I didn't make that up
2 my head because I think about that every fucking day.

3 CAPTAIN ROWE: Okay.

4 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I just don't -- like you know
5 maybe I -- I'm not meaning to fuck up your mind, but I feel
6 mine's all fucked up, and I don't know what to. I don't know
7 how to make sense of anything. I feel like I kind of have
8 talked about

9 --

10 CAPTAIN ROWE: But you want me to feel like shit?

11 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I'm not trying to make you feel
12 shit. I just want you to acknowledge to me that you put me in
13 really humiliating circumstance and that it was forced. I'm
14 saying the word rape, so don't freak out about it, but I just
15 I did not choose to have -- when you told Jeremy to come over
16 and for me to like do whatever to his thing, I wasn't choosing
17 to do that, and you knew that I didn't want to do that.
18 didn't even want to do it. He wanted to leave. He was like,
19 Jim, let's go. But you were so mad at me, and you just kept
20 being -- saying mean things. I mean, I wasn't wanting that to
21 happen. I didn't anything that day to happen. So when you
22 oh, you wanted that to happen, no, I didn't want it to happen.

1 CAPTAIN ROWE: No, I never said that. I never said
2 did. I never said anybody did. It was just a fucked up
3 situation. Then if you were humiliated, I'm sorry, but I
4 mean to.

5 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Okay. Well, I felt like you made
6 do the sex thing with you and Jeremy, and I do feel disgusting
7 about it. I do feel like I need to die for it.

8 CAPTAIN ROWE: No, no. There was nothing --

9 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I do. I'm so like sick. If Ben
10 ever like even thought something like that happen, it would
11 -- Ben would probably kill himself. So why don't I just do it
12 for him.

13 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. I don't think what happened you
14 think happened. You did not have sex with Jeremy.

15 LIEUTENANT KLAY: You told him to come over in front
16 of me, and you were like, Jeremy, come on, blah, blah, blah.
17 She's going to show you what a slut she is. You don't
18 saying that?

19 CAPTAIN ROWE: No.

20 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Because I remember it almost every
21 day. I think of various moments of it, but usually at night
22 I'm trying to sleep.

1 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, you're not.

2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: What's that?

3 CAPTAIN ROWE: You're not. Okay. Just know that,
4 you're not.

5 LIEUTENANT KLAY: But I feel like I was. And now,
6 know, you brought up other stuff of like really bad things
7 happened in my past in my life, which usually --

8 CAPTAIN ROWE: My point was -- my point was --
9 me, let's not ever say that that was one of our, your, mine
10 anybody's finest moment, okay? Can we agree on that?

11 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I know it wasn't anybody's finest
12 moment, but I have to think about it every fucking day. It's
13 my like room. Like now I'm sober, and I can't not think of it
14 because of alcohol, and it's like I really do, I just want to
15 like die.

16 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, what would make you feel

17 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I don't know. I guess you're my
18 friend that I trust. If you just acknowledge to me that I
19 didn't want to participate in that, that just -- or just
20 anything. You're like --

21 CAPTAIN ROWE: Okay. All right. I did not know,
22 now I do, that you did not want to, and I'm sorry.

1 LIEUTENANT KLAY: And what about when you said the
2 thing about Marv? Were you joking then, because I'm paranoid
3 about that.

4 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. There is no Marv. There is no
5 Marv. We were joking. There's nothing. The only thing I
6 for you that day was to just stop and see what you were doing
7 yourself.

8 LIEUTENANT KLAY: But ...

9 CAPTAIN ROWE: What you were doing to me.

10 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I felt like you stopped me, and
11 you -- like I can't ever take any of that shitty day -- you
12 what, like whatever happened the night before, I don't have
13 memory of it. I really don't know if anything -- I don't even
14 think if anything happened with that marine. Didn't Jeremy
15 him with his clothes on anyways?

16 CAPTAIN ROWE: It did. No, no, no, no.

17 LIEUTENANT KLAY: That's what Jeremy said when I
18 talked to him.

19 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, that's the -- yeah. I mean, it
20 was -- who knows, and I don't even want to speculate.

21 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Okay. So I just want to know.
22 in no way felt like you were forcing me whatsoever? I just

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1 to hear that, forcing me to have sex whatsoever with like --
2 because you said that it didn't happen, but Jeremy was -- I
3 a very like distinct memory, and unless I'm going
4 which I'm starting to think maybe I am, like Jeremy was like
5 front of me, I saw his little like belly, I saw him like unzip
6 his pants. Remember, he like came early, and you made some
7 about it. You said some joke about Jeremy cumming really

8 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. I think -- I mean, I remember
9 coming up there. When he came up, you were on top of me.

10 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I was never on top of you. I was
11 always on my hands and knees the entire time.

12 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. No. You never. Wait a minute.
13 You never did anything with Jeremy.

14 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Then I feel like I'm just making
15 up in my head and like --

16 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. He came -- he came up there.

17 LIEUTENANT KLAY: What did he do when he was up

18 CAPTAIN ROWE: He jacked off.

19 LIEUTENANT KLAY: So in no way was it like -- you
20 don't think it was like a --

21 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. I think you remember it. I
22 it was awkward because he came up there and he saw us because

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1 the door was open, and I remember --

2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: And he thought it looked fucked
3 He was like he knew that I didn't want to participate.

4 CAPTAIN ROWE: Yeah.

5 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Because I was like crying, and you
6 were saying insulting things. He probably knew. It was his
7 instinct like, wow, he's calling a slut and whore, and blah,
8 blah, blah. She probably -- this is fucked up. He probably
9 it was fucked up. But why -- like he didn't even want to do.
10 He wanted to go. He even said, Jim, let's go. Jim, let's go.
11 can still hear him saying that in my fucking house.

12 CAPTAIN ROWE: Yeah, and then after that -- because
13 called -- I remember calling Gunney, because you said call
14 Gunney, and we left, and then I came back later that
15 and we went upstairs.

16 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I just -- I guess I just want to
17 know why. Like, why did you -- what was the reason? Did you
18 want to just completely -- because you felt like I humiliated
19 you, did you just want to like take everything? It doesn't
20 sense, because later that day you were helping me, so that's
21 like my mind is conflicted because I'm like, I trust him, he's
22 helping me, and for some reason --

1 CAPTAIN ROWE: I wasn't -- I wasn't -- I wasn't --

2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Because that day I did feel like
3 almost like saved my life because you told me not to kill
4 myself, because I was going to, but at the same time that
5 morning --

6 CAPTAIN ROWE: Because I told myself later on that
7 -- I told myself --

8 LIEUTENANT KLAY: But that morning I wanted to kill
9 myself, and part of it was like that was the last straw. You
10 were my friend and friend that I trusted. My life had gone to
11 shit, and you had made me participate in a humiliating like
12 sexual thing that was disgusting. Regardless of any mistake
13 I've ever made in my life, that one's fucked me up in the head
14 the worst. I just don't understand why -- why -- why you did
15 it. I don't understand. I can understand why you helped me
16 because I think you're my friend, but I don't -- I can't
17 it in my mind. I have like three friends in the world.

18 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, let me ask you -- can I ask you
19 something?

20 LIEUTENANT KLAY: What?

21 CAPTAIN ROWE: Why didn't you ever tell me that I
22 wasn't the only one?

1 LIEUTENANT KLAY: See, you're just avoiding --
2 just avoiding like all I'm asking. I'm not even asking for
3 anything that much. I'm just asking for a small
4 that took away the last straw of my dignity.

5 CAPTAIN ROWE: That bothers me seriously. Why?

6 LIEUTENANT KLAY: What was your question again?

7 CAPTAIN ROWE: Why didn't you ever tell me that I
8 wasn't the only one?

9 LIEUTENANT KLAY: You knew I was all fucked up. I
10 told you I was like an alcoholic and depressed. That's why we
11 had that in common. I've always been like fucked up sexually.
12 I couldn't have sex with my husband because of anorexia and
13 disorders, all kinds of crap. That's stuff that happened when
14 was a kid. I've always been messed up in the head, like it's
15 just something the way --

16 CAPTAIN ROWE: I mean, why didn't, why didn't you --
17 why didn't you ever just tell me, hey, you know, just for
18 sake, you're not the only one?

19 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Okay. But you're avoiding again,
20 regardless of your anger.

21 CAPTAIN ROWE: Okay. But can you tell me that? Can
22 you tell me that?

1 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I don't know, because I was --
2 if anything did happen, I was so drunk, I had no idea if it
3 did happen. I mean, I was like -- do you know how many times
4 was like blocked out drunk that summer?

5 CAPTAIN ROWE: Because to this day ... can I tell
6 something, now that we're talking about who's more fucked up?

7 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Well, I already said I think I'm
8 probably more fucked up than you. I'm not trying to contest
9 that.

10 CAPTAIN ROWE: No, no. I probably am because to
11 date I can't have sex with my wife because I'm scared to give
12 her something. I'm so scared that I have something, that I
13 won't go to the friggin' doctor.

14 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Okay. So that still doesn't
15 my question of why you did that. That completely -- why you
16 me do that.

17 CAPTAIN ROWE: Why did you do it?

18 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Why did I do it? I did not want
19 do it. I was so --

20 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. Why did you like lie to me that
21 whole time?

22 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I didn't.

1. CAPTAIN ROWE: I mean, look. This is the last --

2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: You're taking away -- you're
3 away from -- I'm asking you a question, it's like you're like
4 completely avoiding it, and you keep shifting it to other
5 things.

6 CAPTAIN ROWE: Okay. Why did I do it?

7 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah.

8 CAPTAIN ROWE: Why did I do it?

9 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah. I just want to know why.
10 That's it.

11 CAPTAIN ROWE: Because I was drunk, and it felt

12 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Are you serious? To me that
13 sound like a good enough reason for -- I don't almost believe
14 you because I feel like you knew you were humiliating me, and
15 don't think that you're --

16 CAPTAIN ROWE: No, I didn't. I swear to God. I
17 to God. When you get a text message from somebody that said
18 basically, hey, if you ever want to have a threesome,
19 the night --

20 LIEUTENANT KLAY: No, I didn't. I said I would
21 introduce you to that girl, Shalin (ph). There was a --

22 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. You have a selective memory.

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1 Actually, I kept the text message.

2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: That's good. I'm glad you did.
3 doesn't. You're really helping --

4 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, I'm not going to lie to you,
5 a little bit of a turn on.

6 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Well, you know what, like that
7 fucked me up in the head, so it's not really funny to me.

8 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. It fucked me up in the head,
9 and now you -- I mean, I'm sorry. All right. I'm sorry. I
10 not purposely try to humiliate you. If you can't believe
11 then maybe you're really not my friend, but remember -- you
12 remember when you hit me like 30 straight times?

13 LIEUTENANT KLAY: No, I don't, but ...

14 CAPTAIN ROWE: When you were drunk?

15 LIEUTENANT KLAY: No, I don't remember a lot of
16 when I drink.

17 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, you can't use that as an
18 You remember, because we talked about it before.

19 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I wasn't surprised because I kind
20 hated you. I mean, you said a lot of mean things to me, you
21 know? It's like --

22 CAPTAIN ROWE: Never ever think for a second that I

1 didn't --

2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: That you what?

3 CAPTAIN ROWE: That I didn't like you. I mean,
4 think that I didn't like you. But, I mean, my question now
5 where do we go from here? Like what was the purpose of this
6 conversation.

7 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I just like -- because I --

8 CAPTAIN ROWE: You know we can't be talking all the
9 time.

10 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I know. I'm not trying to talk to
11 you all the time. I would rather have had this conversation
12 person. I just wanted to have -- I mean, I feel like --

13 CAPTAIN ROWE: Like of all days, like why today?
14 brought it up today?

15 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I don't know. I think about it
16 the time. I thought Megan was already out there, actually.
17 I mean, I don't know. I obsess about it. Sunday night was
18 another night when I was -- I spent three hours researching
19 after Ben went home, like how would I try to kill myself, and
20 then I was like --

21 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, I don't want you to kill
22 yourself.

1 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I know.

2 CAPTAIN ROWE: And I told you, if you need anything
3 ever, you just call me.

4 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I think -- I feel like that's the
5 only way I can like (inaudible) like everything that happened
6 there with Wilson, everything.

7 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. Then they win. If you kill
8 yourself, they win. They got to you.

9 LIEUTENANT KLAY: But I feel like you maybe even
10 that, because then like your secrets would go to the grave,
11 then everybody would be happy.

12 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. I don't have any secrets. I
13 have any secrets. I have -- I mean, Megan knows that --

14 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Well, to give you like my last
15 of dignity, and we can move on to another subject so it
16 end badly, but to be very clear, I did not want to do that.
17 That was not something I would ever have desired, and I think
18 you deep down know that.

19 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, can I put your mind at ease?

20 LIEUTENANT KLAY: What's that?

21 CAPTAIN ROWE: I don't think ? - you didn't do what
22 you thought you did.

1 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Okay.

2 CAPTAIN ROWE: And I can't speak for --

3 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I'll try to convince myself of
4 but I, for some reason --

5 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. I'm telling you. I'm telling
6 right now. I promise you.

7 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I asked my therapist, I was like,
8 there a pill I can take so I don't remember certain days of my
9 life, and she's like, wow, she's like, no, you'll have to like
10 cope with them. She wants me to do like this prolonged
11 therapy thing where I have to talk about it with her all the
12 time, and I don't feel comfortable doing that because you have
13 to like do into to a recorder. So I told her I would just --
14 make a list of things that I'm avoiding, and then like I told
15 her I'm like afraid to go to the gym. And so she said like
16 a week during a time there won't be many people to maybe go
17 there with my husband or something. That's like her idea.

18 CAPTAIN ROWE: Why are you scared to go to the gym?

19 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I'm just freaked out about it.
20 I can tell you if I do kill myself, the two places I would do
21 are Post Five Gym or in my bedroom.

22 CAPTAIN ROWE: If you kill yourself, they win, all

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1 people, all that stuff.

2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Well, you would win, too, so maybe
3 it's a good thing.

4 CAPTAIN ROWE: No, I don't. I don't. I don't win.
5 don't understand what you want from me. I really don't, and
6 I'm freaked out.

7 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I didn't mean to freak you -- I'm
8 not trying to freak you out. I feel like every day my day is
9 like this weird day where I pretend like everything's okay,
10 I smile, and I'm like not drinking, and I put on my make-up
11 I put on clothes like everything's fine, but like every day --

12 CAPTAIN ROWE: It's not going to be better if you
13 drink. At some point --

14 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I'm not drinking. I haven't drank
15 for 152 days. I haven't drank. I don't even want to drink.
16 You know what, you know why I don't want to drink is because
17 drinking reminds me of that fucked up day. Also, if I drink
18 again, I know I would try to kill myself. I know I would.
19 There's just no doubt in my mind.

20 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. What I'm telling you is that at
21 some point you've got to forgive yourself, and you've got to
22 forgive everybody else because --

1 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I haven't forgave myself yet, but
2 since you're my friend, and I feel like you've cleaned up your
3 act and stuff, I just wanted to hear in my mind --

4 CAPTAIN ROWE: I'm sorry.

5 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I didn't want you to tell me like

6 CAPTAIN ROWE: Like I'm so sorry.

7 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I didn't want to hear you tell me
8 that I made it up in my mind, and that's what I feel like
9 kind of telling me. I mean --

10 CAPTAIN ROWE: No, no. I'm not telling you that at
11 all.

12 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I know I was the one that taught
13 like, oh, it's good to compartmentalize. That's how I get by
14 life. But that's like what's fucked up my head. You know
15 I mean?

16 CAPTAIN ROWE: Yeah, believe me, you're the one that
17 told me that.

18 LIEUTENANT KLAY: No. I said I did tell --

19 CAPTAIN ROWE: If you recall, I had about two months
20 where I was a mess.

21 LIEUTENANT KLAY: No, I think it was like -- I mean,
22 it was like the worst perfect storm because you had the same

1 problems that I did. You were an alcoholic. You hated 8th
2 I and had problems like --

3 CAPTAIN ROWE: I hated 8th and I, and all that stuff
4 has brought us together.

5 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Okay. Well, not trying to make
6 have a relapse or anything.

7 CAPTAIN ROWE: But listen to me. Listen to me. If
8 carry this stuff around -- if I carry -- this is the thing
9 learned. If we keep carrying all the fucked up shit around --

10 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Okay.

11 CAPTAIN ROWE: -- the only thing we hurt is -- yeah,
12 we hurt ourselves, but we hurt everybody around us because we
13 never get better. I asked my therapist straight up, should I
14 tell my wife, because it bothers me every day.

15 LIEUTENANT KLAY: What did he say?

16 CAPTAIN ROWE: Because that's --

17 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Did you tell your therapist about
18 the forced sexual encounter, or did you tell him a different
19 version?

20 CAPTAIN ROWE: No, we didn't talk about that
21 specifically. I just told him, and he said, look, when you
22 people --

1 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I'd be curious what your therapist
2 says if you do, because you told me to tell my therapist
3 everything, so I told my therapist, without names, because
4 I'm just trying to resolve the issues, not chase people down,
5 the situation.

6 CAPTAIN ROWE: Yeah, and that's --

7 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I told her -- I'll just tell you.
8 what I told her. I said he said he's sorry, but he either
9 it didn't happen, and he's like my friend that I trust, but I
10 was like, but I feel like even if it was revenge or whatever,
11 just want him to acknowledge to me that he did force that sex
12 happen.

13 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I feel like you want me to like
14 acknowledge something in a court of law or something.

15 CAPTAIN ROWE: I'm not talking about in a court of
16 law. I mean, you can name it whatever you want to name it.
17 not calling it the R word. I'm not even going to go in that
18 direction. It was just -- it was so fucked up.

19 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah, because, one, there was no
20 involved.

21 CAPTAIN ROWE: Okay. I mean, this is probably just
22 better conversation to have in person because this is not like

1 going anywhere. I don't mean to have caused you relapse. I'm
2 happy that you haven't been drinking, so I hope that this
3 conversation doesn't make you drink again.

4 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Don't think -- don't be -- because
5 think that part of you thinks that you're like jealous that
6 think I'm doing okay. I'm sitting out here in a fucking house
7 in Oklahoma by myself getting ready to get out of the Marine
8 Corps as soon as I can, and my marriage is barely hanging on
9 a thread.

10 CAPTAIN ROWE: All right. Well, I guess -- I know
11 that you -- I don't know. I feel like you are sorry, but I
12 want to close it up in my mind and try to forget about it, but
13 don't -- I guess if I did willingly do that, then I do deserve
14 to die.

15 LIEUTENANT KLAY: No. It wasn't what you thought,
16 and, no, it's nothing to do -- it's just not --

17 CAPTAIN ROWE: I guess I just want to know why it
18 happened is my number one thing. I just don't understand. I
19 mean, I understand you're angry at me. I embarrassed you. I
20 humiliated you. I was a drunk mess. You know, I did a fucked
21 up thing. Who knows if anything happened, because I really
22 blackout drunk. I don't remember anything past entering the

1 house that night. Nothing. Nothing at all.

2 So, you know, when you said I'm going to tell Ben
3 the command, I had no idea what the fuck had happened the last
4 12 hours of the night; no idea. I had no idea what I had
5 I just knew that the number one thing was to make sure that
6 -- if I did some fucked up thing, I needed to fix it, so I
7 never humiliate Ben, because that's the last thing I'd ever
8 to do. And so I felt -- I felt like you forced me to
9 in a humiliating sexual thing with Jeremy, and Jeremy didn't
10 want to either. That's the thing, Jeremy didn't want to do
11 Do you feel bad about that?

12 CAPTAIN ROWE: I didn't want to do it. Nobody -- it
13 wasn't -- it wasn't what you thought it was. If it makes you
14 feel better --

15 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Well, if you have any drug that
16 know of that I can take that I can just like zone out and veg
17 out, like that's what I -- I asked them -- I keep asking my
18 therapist about that.

19 CAPTAIN ROWE: I don't know what -- Megan's calling
20 me. You know, I've talked to you, so now I'm going to have to
21 answer this question. I mean, pretty much here's what I want
22 you to do. I want you to go to the cops, and then me and you

1 fight this out in court

2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Oh, my gosh.

3 CAPTAIN ROWE: Because now I'm pissed. Yeah, now
4 pissed. Because what you think in your mind happened didn't
5 happen. So let's do it up, and that way everybody can hear
6 whole story and the whole ten months in every detail, and
7 do it up that way.

8 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Oh, that's definitely going to
9 not kill myself. I appreciate your help.

10 CAPTAIN ROWE: And if that's going -- that way Megan
11 can kill herself, Ben can kill himself. You know, everybody
12 just be depressed, and then you and I can feel better because
13 were able to hash out our problems.

14 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I wasn't try to say any hack out
15 thing. I was just trying to -- I was just trying to -- you
16 you're one of my friends. You're one of the people I trust.
17 just tried to make sense of it. I would rather --

18 CAPTAIN ROWE: I thought you were my friend, so why
19 are you calling like trying to start a fight with me?

20 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I'm not trying to start a fight.
21 just think we --

22 CAPTAIN ROWE: I haven't been this upset in a while

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1 this kind of allegation. I don't know how many times I can
2 you that I would never do anything to purposely humiliate and
3 hurt you. If I did, and it sounds like I did, okay, and I'll
4 admit that -- okay, apparently I did, and I'm sorry. God, I'm
5 sorry. I know that you would never knowingly and purposely do
6 anything like that unless you thought it's what I wanted or
7 I was telling you to let happen.

8 LIEUTENANT KLAY: What I needed to do to make sure
9 that I didn't humiliate my husband.

10 CAPTAIN ROWE: Yeah.

11 LIEUTENANT KLAY: That's the last thing. I've
12 humiliated myself before, and that's fine, but the last thing
13 can do is humiliate my husband, and I feel like that day I --

14 CAPTAIN ROWE: And if I used that ?- if I insinuated
15 and used that -- are you saying that I did?

16 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yes.

17 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, then I'm sorry, and I don't
18 remember because I was drunk. So if I did, or it came across
19 that way and you and I had a conversation that day when we
20 arguing, then I'm sorry if I made you feel like you needed to
21 let Jeremy come upstairs and look at you in your bed or
22 whatever. I'm sorry.

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1 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Well, he didn't just look at me.
2 just felt like it was like your best friend, and you and your
3 best friend -- even though I don't feel like Jeremy even
4 to be there, he was just kind of like, what the fuck, like
5 whatever, but I guess I just felt like -- I mean, that day I
6 just was like life can't be this bad. I have to like -- I
7 live with this.

8 CAPTAIN ROWE: You're not that bad. Put it on me.
9 I'm the terrible person.

10 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I'm not trying to put it on you, I
11 just, I'm just trying to work --

12 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, why don't you tell me. What do
13 you think you did? What do you think? Just be honest.

14 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I think that I got really hammered,
15 and I was really upset about that Gillespie thing. I wanted
16 go find Gillespie and like, you know, really kick his ass for
17 real that time.

18 I was hammered, and I knew that the barracks was
19 to not handle that case correctly. I knew everybody was
20 I knew nobody would believe me. I knew Suzanne was sleeping
21 with everybody in my chain of command. You know, I just
22 felt humiliated. Everything was already done.

1 The only thing that was important to me was not
2 humiliating my husband. That was the number -- like that was
3 the only thing I was willing to -- like I would do anything to
4 not do that, you know, and I felt like that day you kind of
5 pretty much put it into position to where -- it wasn't because
6 you guys were like, oh, we're attracted to her, we're turned
7 we're going to -- like it was this fun thing.

8 It was like you calling me really derogatory names
9 making like a joke out of me to Jeremy and Jeremy like
10 hesitantly participating, but he did, as I remember, and it
11 just weird.

12 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. I mean, what do you think you
13 to Jeremy? What do you think happened between you two?

14 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I think that -- I remember that
15 were like, Jeremy, come over, and Arianna is going to show you
16 what a slut she is. And then I just remember Jeremy like
17 pulling down his pants, or whatever, and he had like this
18 belly, and he had like a small whatever, and he was -- you
19 like, go ahead, Jeremy, put it in her mouth, and then you told
20 me to -- you were like, go ahead, blah, blah, blah.

21 I don't remember what your exact were, but basically
22 felt like you forced me have oral sex with Jeremy. I mean, I

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1 don't know if it's -- I don't know. It was just fucked up.
2 was weird. You know, I think you knew that I didn't want to.
3 don't understand. In my mind, if you really thought that I
4 wanted to, then I really do --

5 CAPTAIN ROWE: Okay. Then what happened? Was I
6 sitting there watching?

7 LIEUTENANT KLAY: No. You were behind.

8 CAPTAIN ROWE: So I was just standing behind you
9 watching?

10 LIEUTENANT KLAY: You weren't just standing behind
11 watching. Do you remember how mad you were?

12 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. So then what happened?

13 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I think you know what happened. I
14 mean, you were like I'm going to tell the command that you're
15 slut. You're a horrible blah, blah, blah. I was on my hands
16 and knees, and you were saying your mean things and doing a
17 bunch of gross sex stuff that I didn't want to do, and I feel
18 like you knew I didn't want to do it. I mean, we weren't like
19 having a good time. I was like crying and like I felt
20 humiliated.

21 CAPTAIN ROWE: Were we already having sex when
22 came up there?

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1 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah, you were already doing it,
2 you were like, Jeremy, come here. Arianna's going to show you
3 what a slut she is, and Jeremy walked over in front of me, you
4 know. Like I have to think -- like I think about that. It's
5 sad. I think about it the same way I think about like getting
6 gas because I think about it so often in my mind. It's on
7 repeat when a movie just won't go forward.

8 You know, how can I have kids? How can I move on
9 my life? I'm like this fucked up person. Should I just tell
10 Ben I'm like fucked up in the head and then like say sorry
11 it, or should I -- I feel like it'd be easier if I just did
12 myself. I feel like it'd be easier because then he can just --
13 everybody can just think, oh, she was like fucked up and
14 depressed, and then nobody has to deal with it.

15 I felt like if I quit drinking and did all these
16 things, life would get better.

17 CAPTAIN ROWE: Yeah.

18 LIEUTENANT KLAY: But I --

19 CAPTAIN ROWE: It will.

20 LIEUTENANT KLAY: How much longer?

21 CAPTAIN ROWE: Can I call you back in just second?
22 I've got to call Megan back.

1 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah, actually Ben's going to come
2 home soon, so I have to actually go anyways, but I don't want
3 leave on a bad note.

4 CAPTAIN ROWE: I'm scared you're going to kill
5 yourself now.

6 LIEUTENANT KLAY: All right. All right. Bye.

7 CAPTAIN ROWE: Call me back in like five minutes.

8 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Okay. Bye.

9 (Audio ends.)

10 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Hello?

11 CAPTAIN ROWE: Hey.

12 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Is everything fine?

13 CAPTAIN ROWE: Yeah, she's just -- the movers are
14 coming tomorrow. She's been, I mean, real good through this.

15 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah. I mean, I think
16 going to be fine. I think that can get over -- like I have
17 really good days and really bad days. I guess the one thing I
18 really --

19 CAPTAIN ROWE: Can I -- can I tell you something?

20 LIEUTENANT KLAY: What?

21 CAPTAIN ROWE: And this is something I need you to
22 know. Never, ever, ever think that I didn't like you a real

1 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I just don't understand if you did
2 like me, then why would you force me to do something so gross
3 like that sexual thing with Jeremy? I mean even if you said
4 you know, even if I did send you the text thing, whatever,
5 a couple months prior about some weird thing with Shalin, I
6 mean, did you really -- if I was really -- if I'm really your
7 friend, which I think I am your friend, I just don't
8 Was it just like when you accidently punch your friend in the
9 face kind of a thing?

10 CAPTAIN ROWE: It's --

11 LIEUTENANT KLAY: What's that?

12 CAPTAIN ROWE: It's probably -- I mean, yeah. It's
13 like if -- when Jeremy and I got in a fight, and this was in
14 Iraq earlier on, and we were just both so frustrated with the
15 situation, the stress of what was about to happen, we didn't
16 mad at the situation, we ended up getting mad at each other.

17 LIEUTENANT KLAY: So don't you think it was good for
18 Jeremy to know like -- for you to at least not tell him like,
19 oh, I never punched you in the face; you imagined it
20 Don't you think it would be like weird for Jeremy, you know
21 I mean, just to be like, yeah, this --

22 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. What I told Jeremy was I wasn't

1 mad at you; I was mad at the situation.

2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: That's what you told --

3 CAPTAIN ROWE: I would never do anything -- I would
4 never do anything to hurt you.

5 LIEUTENANT KLAY: So you and Jeremy did talk about
6 I guess?

7 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. I was talking about the
8 in Iraq.

9 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Oh.

10 CAPTAIN ROWE: That's what we talked about later.
11 It's like, hey, I'm not mad at you. I'm stressed out about
12 war and the situation. We took it out on each other. I would
13 never do anything to hurt my friend purposely.

14 LIEUTENANT KLAY: So even if you --

15 CAPTAIN ROWE: In a moment -- in moment of anger, I
16 may do something that I don't know that's going to hurt them
17 stay with them or scar them, which apparently this has, but I
18 would never try to put lifelong or month long hurt on

19 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah. I understand that, but I
20 want to understand that a forced sex situation happened and it
21 was wrong, and even if it was in anger, or even if you wanted
22 I don't even know what you were thinking in your mind. I do a

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1 lot of like -- I've done so many stupid bad things, so I'm not
2 judging you. I just -- for my own like dignity sake, I just
3 want you to acknowledge that it was forced sex, because I
4 you do know that it was. I think you do know that it was
5 humiliating, and I feel like --

6 CAPTAIN ROWE: It was fucked up, and I've never
7 thought about it as much as I've thought about it this last
8 we've talked about it, and I will admit to you that it's
9 up, and I'm sorry.

10 LIEUTENANT KLAY: But do you think it was fucked up
11 I mean, do you think it's fucked up because -- because like in
12 my mind, the first like two months I like blamed it like
13 entirely on myself, and then like I guess I was thinking
14 you know. Yeah, I did a really fuck up. Why was in my house
15 with my door wide open so drunk that I remember nothing, you
16 know, naked?

17 CAPTAIN ROWE: (inaudible)

18 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah. Why was that? That's a
19 fucked up situation, really fucked up on so many levels. I
20 like horrified.

21 CAPTAIN ROWE: And why didn't I just drive by? Why
22 didn't I just say, oh, she's dead in there, she's dead in

1 oh well?

2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: That's fine. And I know there's
3 like why didn't you do this, why didn't this. I just wanted
4 to be that I'm not making up in my mind because you were like,
5 oh, nothing happened. I just want it to be not made up in my
6 mind that you -- you may not even remember certain things.

7 CAPTAIN ROWE: I will tell you this. You didn't
8 sex with Jeremy. You may have had oral sex with Jeremy, but
9 didn't have sex with Jeremy.

10 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah, but did you make him come
11 there or did Jeremy want to come over there?

12 CAPTAIN ROWE: To your house?

13 LIEUTENANT KLAY: No, come over to the oral sex
14 or whatever.

15 CAPTAIN ROWE: I didn't -- I didn't pull his pants
16 down, and I didn't shove her head on it.

17 LIEUTENANT KLAY: But didn't you tell him to?

18 CAPTAIN ROWE: Yeah. I mean, I wouldn't say I told
19 him. I probably invited him to.

20 LIEUTENANT KLAY: You invited him to come see what a
21 slut I was?

22 CAPTAIN ROWE: I don't remember the words. I mean,

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1 you can say whatever, and I couldn't tell you yes or no.

2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Well, at least it feels better
3 you at least like acknowledge something happened, because I
4 really do feel like sometimes like I'm going crazy in my head
5 something.

6 CAPTAIN ROWE: I mean, you didn't -- I mean --

7 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I feel like it was directed, like
8 was orchestrated by you. Like, okay, yeah, I did the fucked
9 things the night before, and I did all these fucked up
10 situations, but I felt like what happened in the bedroom
11 upstairs was directed by you. You wanted it to happen; you
12 know, I didn't. Just like the night before, I was
13 the drunken like crazy debauchery, humiliation, whatever.

14 CAPTAIN ROWE: Okay. Are we both admitting that we
15 both had a part in it?

16 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I'm not, not in the bedroom thing.
17 I don't think that I wanted to do that in my mind. You just
18 have to digest that you can't -- like it's fucking up my head.

19 CAPTAIN ROWE: No, you didn't -- you didn't ask us.
20 mean, you didn't say, hey, Jim why don't we -- you did say
21 earlier that day, why don't Jeremy and you spend the night

22 LIEUTENANT KLAY: What?

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1 CAPTAIN ROWE: Yeah, you did.

2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: That doesn't even make any sense.

3 CAPTAIN ROWE: Because all that day you were like
4 we going -- are you going to be able to come over afterwards
5 into town, blah, blah, blah, and I was like I don't know.

6 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah, I don't remember. I mean,
7 that time maybe -- like maybe I might have said something
8 I don't remember. I definitely was scared. I definitely
9 to kill myself and everything, but even though I did all that
10 fucked up stuff, I don't think that it meant, hey, you and
11 Jeremy come have sex with me because now it's like a good
12 opportunity, and I'm as low as I'm going to go, and like take
13 two percent left of dignity and just like throw it out the

14 And you're right, I think I can build it up, like I
15 can build it up, but I don't want it to be like a made up
16 in my head, because it's going to be, like it's making me

17 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. Now, I will tell you this. It's
18 not. Don't make yourself out to be super hooker, whore, like
19 was wild, dirty video type. It wasn't no. No. It was like
20 fifteen year olds being weird.

21 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah, but I had been -- I think I
22 had been weird prior to that, but how did I -- I don't feel

1 I -- I guess in my mind like I just think that there's stuff
2 that went on in the bedroom. I mean, I was like crying while
3 happened, like the fact that you didn't like care to me like
4 bothers me, you know.

5 It's like -- it's like -- it was weird. It was like
6 you were having pleasure in my humiliation.

7 CAPTAIN ROWE: No, I wasn't, and I'm not having
8 pleasure in it right now.

9 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I'm not trying to make you feel
10 I just --

11 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, I mean, you've succeeded
12 you were trying to or not.

13 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Okay.

14 CAPTAIN ROWE: I don't know. I mean, can we put an
15 end to this?

16 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah. I think if you just
17 acknowledge to me, I think we can never have this --

18 CAPTAIN ROWE: I'm sorry.

19 LIEUTENANT KLAY: But are you sorry --

20 CAPTAIN ROWE: That what?

21 LIEUTENANT KLAY: What are you sorry -- because you
22 keep saying sorry, but then you never acknowledge that there

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1 like this --

2 CAPTAIN ROWE: I'm sorry that I ended up --

3 LIEUTENANT KLAY: -- forced sexual situation in the
4 bedroom with Jeremy that happened, because I don't want you
5 me that it didn't happen.

6 CAPTAIN ROWE: To me, a forced sexual situation is
7 like holding somebody down, like you know what I'm saying?
8 Forced and the rape word are the same thing to me, so I won't
9 forced is physically making somebody do something, like, here
10 I'm going to hold you and make you do this, and I've never put
11 my hands on a woman, never.

12 LIEUTENANT KLAY: But don't you feel like that I
13 have felt like threatened with, I mean, the situation? You
14 I had just done something so humiliating, and I could never
15 about it to anybody. You know what I mean, like I would have
16 deal with that.

17 CAPTAIN ROWE: Yeah, but like I told you, I also
18 that I would never threaten someone like that because you know
19 I'm that smart, and I know that --

20 LIEUTENANT KLAY: But you did threaten me. You said
21 in the kitchen, you were like, I'm going to tell Ben, I'm
22 to tell ever body, blah, blah, blah, blah, blah, and then when

1 we were in the kitchen, that's when you first said the way
2 it was not going to be said, and you said -- you were like,
3 undressed. You were like, you know, blah, blah, blah, blah,
4 and show Jeremy.

5 CAPTAIN ROWE: Actually, you were undressed when I
6 there.

7 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I was undressed when you got
8 but then -- because I was -- I really had no idea what was
9 on. The first time when I heard your voice yelling at me was
10 when I like came out of my -- that was the first memory I have
11 after midnight.

12 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, I was trying to get your dog
13 of the front yard before it escaped and before the neighbors
14 like came over like wandering around in your house. That
15 have been real cool if the neighbors came over.

16 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Well, what about the Marv thing,
17 though? I mean, like that was like weird. Like I didn't -- I
18 know you joke about it sometimes, but like you're an
19 intimidating person, and you are more -- you are.

20 CAPTAIN ROWE: I am not an intimidating person.

21 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yes, you are. Everybody at the
22 barracks was intimidated by you. They wouldn't like ever mess

1 with you.

2 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, I don't think that's true.

3 LIEUTENANT KLAY: So you don't think there's any way
4 could have been scared when you said that Marv was going to
5 throw me in the ditch, or whatever -- whatever thing you said.

6 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, I guess what I don't understand
7 was if --

8 LIEUTENANT KLAY: You didn't think I like -- you
9 didn't even think I looked scared? Are you saying that you
10 didn't think I looked scared at all?

11 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. Like I've spent hours with you
12 talking to you. My wife's been over to your house. I mean,
13 we've spent hours together and talking for the last six
14 I guess what I'm saying is it just takes me by surprise that
15 this is still in your head.

16 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I guess I was like -- I've just
17 tried to put together in my mind -- I'm not going to do the
18 whole like video recording therapist prolonged exposure thing
19 that she wants to. I mean, there's so many events that
20 at 8th and I that like fucked up my mind. I just feel like
21 that one to at least, as my friend, for you to at least --

22 CAPTAIN ROWE: Yeah. Yeah, and it --

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1 LIEUTENANT KLAY: -- acknowledge that you knew I was
2 scared.

3 CAPTAIN ROWE: I know now that I hurt you. I hurt
4 you.

5 LIEUTENANT KLAY: But did you know at the time that
6 was scared?

7 CAPTAIN ROWE: No. I had no idea, but I know now
8 I put you in a -- in a -- I don't regret it because I don't
9 think if I would have stopped it that day, I don't think you
10 ever would have stopped drinking, and I think you'd be dead.
11 I don't regret stopping by over there. I do regret the fact
12 that I did (inaudible) better.

13 LIEUTENANT KLAY: So I guess you're at least saying
14 that you do regret the stuff that happened upstairs with
15 with like the sexual stuff? I think you knew, even though you
16 don't want to say, that I --

17 CAPTAIN ROWE: Yeah, I regret it now, but I've never
18 thought about it.

19 LIEUTENANT KLAY: How could you not regret it then?
20 mean, like to me like you knew it was fucked up then. I
21 understand you not wanting to think about it, but, you know,
22 like didn't afterward you think, wow, that was really fucked

1 like --

2 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, I mean, I felt maybe that's
3 how -- I mean I don't -- I didn't think about it. I was just
4 I just -- at that point I was like, you know what, we can go
5 or two ways here. Her and I can go straight down the tube
6 together, just drop in a hot mess, you know, like friggin'
7 Bonnie and Clyde, or we can try and be mature here and try to,
8 you know, go on with our lives and not hurt our families and
9 everybody around us.

10 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah.

11 CAPTAIN ROWE: And, you know, the thing that my guy
12 told me was who is going to help by telling your wife? Is it
13 going to get it off your conscience? Yeah, but I mean -- and
14 that's the way he explained it to me. He was like, you know,
15 due time, you know, you'll move on and, you know, things in
16 mind will always be there. But by you telling her, the only
17 person it's going to help is you right now. It's going to
18 destroy her and hurt her and make her have to make all these
19 tough decisions, but you'll feel better because it's off your
20 chest.

21 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Okay. I feel like it's moving
22 from like -- because I really do, like I promise you I never

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1 want to talk about this ever, ever again. Like I really
2 I didn't even want to bring it up today. I thought about it,
3 too, but the main thing is, I just want to know --

4 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, will you listen to me for a
5 second?

6 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Can you listen to me for a second?

7 CAPTAIN ROWE: Okay. Go ahead.

8 LIEUTENANT KLAY: You knew that I -- you knew that I
9 was scared. I'm not even going to say I think because I'm too
10 timid. My therapist told me I'm too timid. You knew that.

11 CAPTAIN ROWE: Hold on. This coming from the person
12 who has like straddled on top of me and hit me 30 or 40 times.

13 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I didn't straddle on top of you.
14 just want to know why --

15 CAPTAIN ROWE: Okay.

16 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Why didn't you ask me that day if,
17 you know, I was okay with that sexual thing, knowing -- is it
18 because you got a text message, so you thought that that kind
19 stuff was okay with me, or why?

20 CAPTAIN ROWE: I thought in my mind that -- I mean,
21 after the stories that you had told me about, like switching
22 partners --

1 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Some of them were just drunk
2 stories, like the same ones that --

3 CAPTAIN ROWE: Yeah. If I think about it now, and I
4 didn't -- let me say this. I didn't think about it at the
5 but if I think about it in my mind now, you know, text message
6 got with you offering for Jeremy to come over, you telling me
7 about like hooking up with, you know, chicks.

8 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I was offering for Jeremy to come
9 over because I wanted to meet your friends.

10 CAPTAIN ROWE: Hold on. Hold on.

11 LIEUTENANT KLAY: It wasn't a sexual thing at all,
12 I know you know that.

13 CAPTAIN ROWE: Hooking up with chicks, whatever, and
14 not -- like I said, the text message, and I've never done
15 anything like that before, and I'm sure Jeremy's never done
16 anything like that before, and now I know that, you know, you
17 haven't. I think it's an experience that we all shared that
18 wish we didn't share. Does that make sense, because I've never
19 - I've never had a situation like that before.

20 And I don't -- maybe I -- maybe I just did it
21 I thought, well, she's done it before, so she must be cool
22 it because, you know, she had some other guy come over here

1 night. That's probably what was going through my drunk mind.

2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: All right. Well Ben's coming home
3 soon anyways, so I'm going to -- I apologize for like
4 you about it.

5 CAPTAIN ROWE: No, but know this. Are we -- you're
6 still -- besides my wife and Jeremy, you're the only other
7 person I talked to.

8 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I don't talk to anybody at all. I
9 really don't have any friends because they think I'm all
10 up in the mind anyways.

11 CAPTAIN ROWE: We're still friends, but sometimes I
12 guess without knowing it, you do something to hurt your
13 and if I did it out of anger and out of spite, I'm sorry. I
14 never meant to hurt you. I'm sorry. I know that you're not
15 that type of person.

16 And here's what you need to understand. Whatever
17 happen, that doesn't replicate you, it doesn't replicate me,
18 doesn't replicate anything. It's just some stupid drunk thing
19 that happened, the same thing as that marine being in your
20 something like that. You know what I'm saying? It's not like
21 you would pick him out to bring him home. It's something
22 that happened. Now you're not drinking, I'm not drinking, so

1 would never happen again, and we would never even have to talk
2 about it again. You've just got to move on.

3 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah.

4 CAPTAIN ROWE: And that's what I'm trying to do.
5 for a second, if I think I'm causing you pain or the fact
6 you know, you're going to kill yourself, that's going to
7 me. So you promise me before you hurt yourself, you call me.

8 LIEUTENANT KLAY: All right.

9 CAPTAIN ROWE: I will get on a friggin' plane.

10 LIEUTENANT KLAY: All right.

11 CAPTAIN ROWE: All right?

12 LIEUTENANT KLAY: All right. Well, have a good
13 and sorry.

14 CAPTAIN ROWE: Hey, one other question. What's
15 on with the Suzanne thing?

16 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I don't even know. I just -- I'm
17 not even -- like I'm not even in the loop. Like I don't talk
18 anybody from barracks, not even (inaudible), so I have no

19 CAPTAIN ROWE: Because I haven't talked to like
20 Haggerty and those guys since before Christmas. I mean, they
21 didn't mention anything about, but I just -- I mean, did you
22 questions or anything, because nobody ever called me, and you

1 told me last time that somebody may call me.

2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: No. I mean, I was just, I don't
3 know, being paranoid. I don't -- nobody's questioned me about
4 it. I mean, I have already made my original statements, but
5 like I think they pretty much -- I'm gone, I'm out of there.
6 You know, so it's like -- I think they're just -- I don't
7 Who knows. I don't know what's going on.

8 CAPTAIN ROWE: You don't think they're going to call
9 me?

10 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I don't -- I don't know. I have
11 idea.

12 CAPTAIN ROWE: Okay. But you don't think they're
13 going call me or question me or anything like that?

14 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I haven't talked to anybody since
15 the last time I talked to you. Nobody's --

16 CAPTAIN ROWE: I mean, here's the truth. The only
17 thing I can say is I never witnessed anything firsthand. The
18 only thing I can say is what you told me and what you

19 LIEUTENANT KLAY: That's fine, whatever. I don't
20 know. Like the Suzanne thing is out of my mind. I'm kind of
21 dealing with my own, just focusing moving on with my life. So
22 anyways, I apologize for the drama stuff, but I'm trying to

1 normalize myself so.

2 CAPTAIN ROWE: So we're still cool? We're still
3 friends?

4 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yup.

5 CAPTAIN ROWE: And you'll tell me if anything bad's
6 going to happen?

7 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah.

8 CAPTAIN ROWE: Before you do something crazy?

9 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yes.

10 CAPTAIN ROWE: All right. It's not worth it because
11 if you do that, then everybody --

12 LIEUTENANT KLAY: I called you today, didn't I? I
13 called you before I did anything crazy because I was just
14 thinking about it.

15 CAPTAIN ROWE: Yeah. Well, I'll tell you this. If
16 you do that, you're stronger than that, you let them win. I
17 thought you were a little bit more of a competitor than that.

18 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Well, it did really hurt me, but
19 did hurt me on that day, but I forgive you.

20 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, I'm sorry, and it's not
21 representative of who you are, it's not representative of who
22 am, and it's not representative -- God, I hope that's not how

1 you remember me.

2 LIEUTENANT KLAY: It won't be at all.

3 CAPTAIN ROWE: Can you try to remember me in a
4 light?

5 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yes. I think once I get out of
6 house and stuff things will be better, too. I just need to
7 out of there.

8 CAPTAIN ROWE: Can you -- can you remember me from
9 like September 1st on?

10 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Yeah. You've been a much nicer,
11 better person so.

12 CAPTAIN ROWE: Well, you taught me how to
13 compartmentalize, so we'll remember each other from September
14 1st on.

15 LIEUTENANT KLAY: That sounds good.

16 CAPTAIN ROWE: All right. Take care.

17 LIEUTENANT KLAY: Okay. Sorry about that. Bye.

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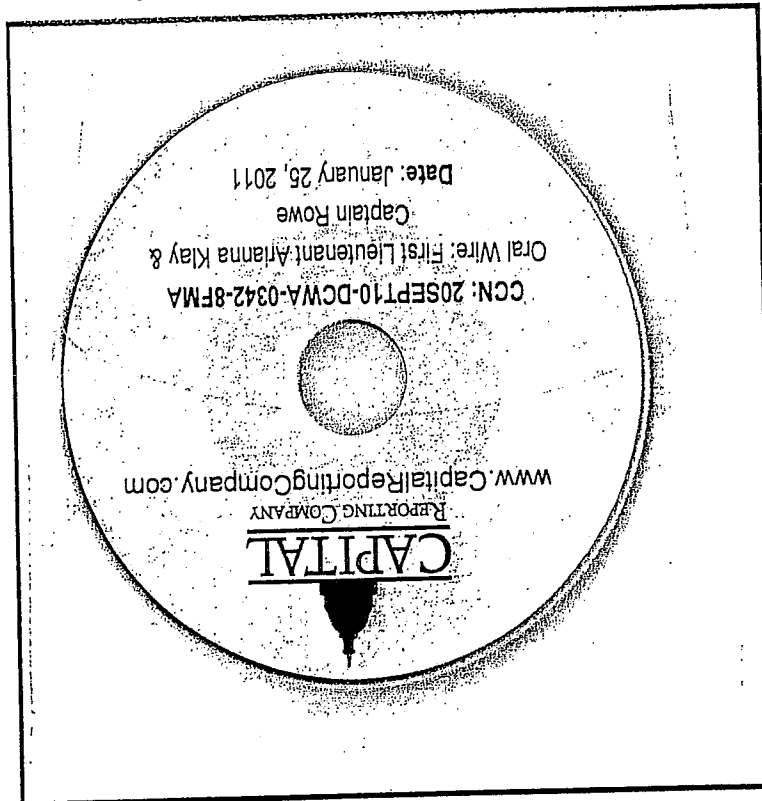
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
