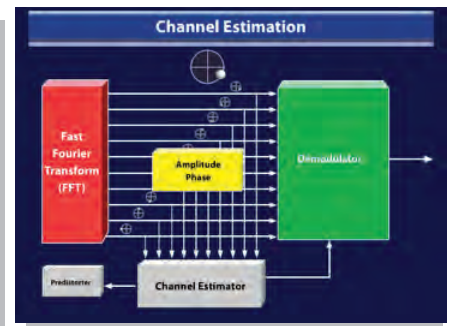

In January 2011, a federal jury in Newark, NJ returned a \$16 million plaintiff's verdict for **Abbott Laboratories** over generic drug manufacturer Glenmark relating to sales of a generic version of plaintiff's hypertension medicine Tarka.

Principal **Doug Maynard** of **Legal Arts** provided extensive pre-trial and trial war room graphics support in Newark. **John Allcock**, **Stuart E. Pollack** and **Erica J. Pascal** of **DLA Piper** represented Abbott Labs.



Federal Defenders of San Diego, Inc. engaged **Visual Evidence** to prepare a 3D-computer reconstruction of an agent-involved shooting at a Southern California Border Patrol checkpoint. By using a scale diagram of the scene and commercially-available 3D vehicle models, **Visual Evidence** was able to create several accurate witness viewpoint renderings in less than a week and under a tight budget. Lead counsel were **John C. Ellis** and **Reuben C. Cahn**.



Trial preparation is currently underway for two military court martials scheduled for April 2011 at Fort Stewart, GA and Camp Pendleton, CA. In both cases, **Legal Arts** principal **Jim Gripp** has been designated as an expert in crime scene reconstruction and 3D-computer animation for the defense.



In Georgia, **U.S. Army Sgt. Joseph Bozicevich**, attached to the Third Infantry Division, will be tried for capital murder (death penalty) of two fellow NCOs at Patrol Base Jurf in Jurf as Sahkr, Iraq. Sgt. Bozicevich is represented by **Charles W. Gittins** of Middletown, VA in addition to military counsel at Fort Stewart. Trial is scheduled for April 12, 2011.



In the California case, **U.S. Marine Corps Sgt. Frank Wuterich's** squad from Kilo Company, 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines was involved in the shooting deaths of 19 civilians following a fatal IED ambush of his convoy in the town of Haditha, Iraq. Sgt. Wuterich is represented by **Neal A. Puckett** and **Haytham Faraj** of **Puckett & Faraj, PC** of Alexandria, VA, and military counsel at Camp Pendleton. Trial is scheduled for April 18, 2011.
