Okay, okay, I hate revealing ANYTHING about the story you are about to read, but if you are buying this book and can't tell by the cover that there will be zombies (and Sith), well then I am sorry to spoil the surprise, but it should be rather obvious.

So, a Star Wars zombie book with our favorite bad guys. But is it any good? Yeah. It is a fun ride, and while I would be tempted to give it 4 stars, there are certain aspects to the Star Wars universe that are introduced that struck me as new and different. Some books are fun to read (like the first Thrawn) because they completely change everything you thought was cool about Star Wars. Other books are worth reading because the story is solid--but the real beauty is the implications the story leaves behind; the questions it raises. IMHO this book falls in the second category.

The plant life in this story is food for thought when you extrapolate that into the overarching SW universe and the Jedi order. Much room for growth, here there is! I like the main Jedi character. I think you will like her as well. She opens up the world of the Jedi past the hack and slash we see in the movies. It shows a much deeper understanding of the Force--something that would be interesting to see explored more deeply in future novels. I think that's what I really liked most about this book. It is less "Luke Skywalker/Han Solo Star Wars," and more "a day in the life of the supporting cast." It adds to the scope of the world of Star Wars but it feels like a behind the scenes story that shows us how things can go wrong in the very places that create heroes and villains, not just on Death Stars and in capitals like Coruscant.

Is it safe for kids? Hmmm... I would put the minimum reading age at 14-15, keeping in mind that it's almost impossible to reach that age without seeing at least one zombie movie or playing a zombie video game, or some other shooter game with gore and blood. While there are moments of descriptive mayhem, it was pretty tame considering this is supposed to be a horror novel. I enjoyed the story, I was deeply afraid my favorite characters would die (you will have to read the book to see if they did), and the villains were villainous to say the least, but it is not a book that will give you nightmares or send you into therapy. It is about as scary as a Victorian horror novel. Like I said--I liked it, but it wasn't Stephen King scary.

If you must know the basic details of the, keep reading; but if not, just now that it is a very dark story with lots of unpleasant surprises and some very "not nice people." I feel as if we are being set up for a larger story, as if this is the beginning of a new area of problems for both the Republic and the Empire. Just for that reason alone it is worth reading.

Okay--so some of the basics of the story without revealing the plot. The story takes place for the most part at an outlying Sith academy where young men and women are trained in the ways of the Force; the dark side of course. In a school like this there is no room for weakness. You fail, you die. It is a much purer way of understanding nature than we see in the mamsy-pamsy Jedi academies where we get to play with flowers and bunnies. The teachers are a bit less forgiving and a bit more exacting in their instruction methods. It would have been nice to see more of this though, as it takes something of a backseat to the real action. The beauty of the Sith students is that the biggest do well but not necessarily as well as the smaller, more determined ones. This educational facility is really all about who can survive by any means at their disposal, not just who is "stronger in the Force." This is good soil

Okay, I'm a bit torn with this one. I am a HUGE Star Wars fan...I enjoy the occasional horror novel as well--however, merging these two genre's and what do you get? Mixed feelings...and I'm apparently not alone.

My initial reaction was one of curious optimism. I learned long ago that making snap decisions based on little information only serves to make you a fool in the long term, so when I first read the description of 'Red Harvest' I thought, 'Hey, why not?' and just looked forward to receiving it in the mail. As for the storyline, it was reasonably well written, definitely not the best Star Wars story available (for that you'll want to check out Timothy Zahn), but I wouldn't say its the worst, either (Kevin J. Anderson, while a good author has written IMO, some of the absolute worst Star Wars prose ever printed). So, where exactly DOES 'Red Harvest' rank? GOOD question. Even after finishing it, I have to say that I simply do not know the answer (how's THAT for being vague, huh?).

I'm not trying to evade anything here, I'm just trying to figure out just how to adequately describe the book and do it justice. In all honesty, placing a horror story inside a story that normally would see characters such as Luke, Han and Yoda certainly seems like it COULD work--and for some I have no doubt it does--but for me, it really just seemed like drinking the last half of a can of pop 3 DAYS after it had been opened...it just fell sorta flat.

Again, story-wise, it was well done, and in another setting with some tweaking here and there, I believe 'Red Harvest' could've been something quite a bit more. Now, with that being said, had I known some of this before I started this particular journey, I seriously think this would have ended up with a solid 4 to 4 1/2 stars. However, I won't give it more than 3 because I wasn't given that warning, and as I mentioned earlier, just found myself kind of wishing the story would end.

Let me just say right off the top that I am not normally a fan of horror books. I realize that the genre is popular now, but zombies and the undead hold no particular appeal for me. However, Red Harvest is a Star Wars book, so I decided to give it a try. I read Death Troopers by the same author last year, so I had some idea of what to expect.

Red Harvest is not a sequel to Death Troopers. The book stands alone. The great majority of the action takes place at a Sith Academy on Odacer-Faustin. Mr. Schreiber does a excellent job of describing the daunting conditions on the planet and the grim atmosphere at the academy. Sith Lord Darth Scabrous is the man in charge at the academy but seems to spend most of his time at the top of a black tower doing mysterious experiments. As seems to be the case with several Sith Lords we have read about, what Scabrous really wants is to find a way to make himself immortal. Of course, his experiments go wrong and we end up with undead creatures all over the place. We also have two Jedi who are caught up in the horror.

Mr. Schreiber's writing is acceptable. The story moves along quickly through short chapters, and I did find that I wanted to see what happened next at the end of each chapter. I suspect that the book will do well enough so that more tales of this Star Wars genre will be published. They are just never going to be my favorites.
