<u>PLAINTIFFS' BRIEF IN SUPPORT OF THEIR RESPONSE TO DEFENDANT'S MOTION FOR SUMMARY DISPOSITION</u>

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Plaintiffs are in the business of selling clothing at their retail establishment in Wayne County, Michigan. Plaintiff's location was raided based on an investigation by Macy's and the Wayne County Sheriff Department. (Exhibit A). Defendant's claim they confiscated stolen and counterfeit items. Defendants' Macy's and Bucher than contacted

Coogi, a clothing designer, informing representatives there that Plaintiffs sold counterfeit items. Defendants knew these statements were false and disclosed this false assertion to representatives from Coogi. Defendants did this to interfere with Plaintiffs legitimate business.

STANDARD OF REVIEW

A summary disposition motion under MCR 2.116(C)(8) tests the legal sufficiency of the claim by the pleadings alone, and the motion may not be supported by documentary evidence. Simko v. Blake, 448 Mich. 648, 654; 532 NW2d 842 (1995). The court accepts as true the complaint's factual allegations and draws all reasonable inferences or conclusions in the nonmoving party's favor. Marcelletti v. Bathani, 198 Mich.App 655, 658; 500 NW2d 124 (1993).

Under MCR 2.116(C)(10) Motion, a party must not rest on mere allegations or denials in its pleadings, but must by affidavit or other documentary evidence set forth specific facts showing that there is not a genuine issue for trial. The Court must grant the nonmoving party the benefit of any reasonable doubt about material facts, the Court must then determine whether a factual dispute exists to warrant a trial. However, the Court may not make factual findings or weigh credibility. Skinner v Square D Co., 445 Mich 153, 161 (1994); Babula v Robertson, 212 Mich App 45, 48 (1995); Bertrand v Alan Ford, Inc., 449 Mich 606, 617-618 (1995).

A material fact has been defined as an ultimate fact issue on which a jury's verdict must be based. Neal v Friendship Manor Nursing Home, 113 Mich App 759, 763.

LAW AND ARGUMENT

- A. Plaintiffs' claim of Conversion has already been dismissed pursuant to a previous Motion for Summary Judgment.
- B. Tortious Interference with a Contract or Advantageous Business Relationship or Expectancy.

After the raid was conducted, Defendants began contacting vendors of Plaintiffs who sold items to Plaintiffs. (Exhibit B) These vendors include specifically Coogi. Plaintiffs assert this position based on conversations he has had with Trevor Clark, a sales representative from Coogi. That further, Mr. Clark advised him that immediately after the raid was conducted, a representative from Macy's contacted Coogi and spoke with Mr. Clark and advised that Goodfellas was selling stolen merchandise. On another occasion, Mr. Clark was at a clothing show, Magic, in Las Vegas, Nevada, when another representative from Macy's again advised that Goodfella's was selling stolen merchandise.

Plaintiff had a contract with its vendors wherein, the vendors would sell their clothing to Goodfella's. Pursuant to MCJI 126.01, the necessary elements are:

- A. Plaintiff had a business relationship or expectancy with [name the third-party] at the time of the claimed interference.
- B. The business relationship or expectancy had a reasonable likelihood of future economic benefit for plaintiff.
- C. Defendant knew of the business relationship or expectancy at the time of the claimed interference.
- D. Defendant intentionally interfered with the business relationship or expectancy.
- E. Defendant improperly interfered with the business relationship or expectancy.

- F. Defendants' conduct caused Plaintiffs to disrupt or terminate the business relationship or expectancy.
- G. Plaintiffs were damaged as a result of Defendants' conduct.

It is clear that Defendants' actions were based on their intent to cease competition from Plaintiffs. Specifically, by advising Coogi and other vendors that Plaintiffs sell counterfeit items, this would stop the vendors from selling merchandise to Plaintiffs. In fact, Coogi did stop selling to Plaintiffs.

C. Conspiracy and Concert of Action

The only argument Defendants provide for dismissing the Conspiracy and Concert of Action's claims is if the prior Tortious Interference with a Contract or Advantageous Business Relationship or Expectancy is also dismissed. Therefore, if the Tortious Interference claims are not dismissed than these two actions must remain.

Further, it is Plaintiffs' position that Macy's and Bucher conspired to use the criminal process, through the Wayne County Sheriff Department, to cause a raid to be performed, merchandise seized, and vendors to be contacted with false allegations of counterfeit merchandise being sold.

CONCLUSION

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs respectfully request this Honorable Court deny Defendants'

Motion for Summary Judgment.

On November 6, 2007 Deputy Maxwell sold 1-pair of COOGI PANTS, 1-COOGI TEE SHIRT to Mohammed Aoun stating that the property was stolen from The clothing marked with hidden identifiers by Macys' personnel.

Macys' security personnel told Affiant that they have observed Mohammed Aoun deliver bags of merchandise to the location to be searched on November 6, 2007.

Macys' security personnel told Affiant that on December 5, 2007 they entered the location to be searched and observed the same merchandise Deputy Maxwell sold to Aoun on November 6, 2007 being sold. Macys' personnel were able to identify the merchandise based upon the above hidden identifiers. The Macys' price tags originally on the clothing had been covered with price tags from Goodfellas Wear.
