As Rules Counsel for the U.S. Marine Corps, I am responsible for reviewing allegations of professional misconduct against Marine judge advocates and determining appropriate action.

After careful review of your complaint and Colonel Smith's response, I requested that the Commanding General, Marine Corps Recruit Depot/Western Recruiting Region, San Diego, appoint an officer to conduct a preliminary inquiry into the allegations according to the procedures in JAG Instruction 5803.1C. I have reviewed the results of the preliminary inquiry, and I have taken appropriate action.
