Subj: CHARACTER STATEMENT FOR CARLOS ROWE, MAJOR, U.S. MARINE CORPS

- 1. I am currently assigned as the Military Personnel Programs Division Chief for the J1 Directorate with U.S. Joint Forces Command. I've been in the Marine Corps 22 years and have recently returned from Afghanistan. My current duties include the management of the Army, Navy, Air Force and Marine Corps personnel evaluations, professional development, and JPME II programs. I provide guidance on execution of all services' policies and regulations and direct the management of the military and civilian honorary awards program to include joint and service awards.
- 2. I have known Major Rowe for approximately 8 years. I first met him in 2002 while I was assigned as the Executive Officer, Recruiting Station Fort Worth, TX. Major Rowe was assigned as the Assistant for Enlisted Recruiting and later the Contact Team Officer, 8th Marine Corps District, New Orleans, LA. In his capacity as the Contact Team Officer, we interacted frequently regarding the programs under my supervision. In 2005 I replaced Major Rowe as the Contact Team based on his recommendation.
