8 Relating to certain chemical compounds, to make it  
9 illegal to possess HU-210, JWH-018, JWH-073, and salvia  
10 divinorum or salvinorum A; and in connection therewith would  
11 have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or  
12 increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of  
13 Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now  
14 appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of  
15 the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

17 Section 1. (a) The possession of the following  
18 chemical compounds shall be illegal in this state:

19 (1) (6aR,10aR)-9-(hydroxymethyl)-6,  
20 6-dimethyl-3-(2methyloctan-2-yl)-6a,7,10,10a -  
21 tetrahydrobenzo[c]chromen-1-ol, some trade or other names:  
22 HU-210.

23 (2) 1-Pentyl-3-(1-naphthoyl)indole, some trade or  
24 other names: JWH-018.

25 (3) 1-Butyl-3-(1-naphthoyl)indole, some trade or  
26 other names: JWH-073.

1           (4) Salvia divinorum or salvinorum A; all parts of  
2 the plant presently classified botanically as salvia  
3 divinorum, whether growing or not, the seeds thereof, any  
4 extract from any part of such plant, and every compound,  
5 manufacture, salts, derivative, mixture, or preparation of  
6 such plant, its seeds or extracts.

7           (b) A violation of subsection (a) shall be subject  
8 to the same penalties as a violation of Sections 13A-12-213  
9 and 13A-12-214, Code of Alabama 1975.

10           Section 2. Although this bill would have as its  
11 purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased  
12 expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further  
13 requirements and application under Amendment 621, now  
14 appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of  
15 the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the  
16 bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an  
17 existing crime.

18           Section 3. This act shall become effective on the  
19 first day of the third month following its passage and  
20 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
