Subj: EX POST FACTO GOOD CONDUCT TIME ANALYSIS

1. Purpose. To implement good conduct time (GCT) rates
consistent with provisions contained within reference (a).

2. Background. Reference (a) corrects reference (b) as follows:

"A2.2.2. With respect to offenses committed prior to January
1, 2005, GCT shall be awarded at the rates specified in DoD
Instruction 1325.7, enclosure 26."

3. Policy. The sentences of all persons now in the control of
the U.S. Marine corrections system with offenses committed prior
to 1 Jan 05, but who were sentenced on or after 1 Jan 05, shall
be modified to reflect the more generous GCT rates possible under
reference (c), enclosure (26).

4. Administration

a. Sentence Computation. In affected cases, manual
computation shall be used. DD Form 2710-1 (Prisoner Sentence
Computation) shall be used.

b. Corrections Management Information System (CORMIS)
Tracking. The following procedures shall be implemented with
CORMIS to ensure case management tracking of affected cases:

(1) Identify the difference in total days of GCT between
the flat rate and variable rate.

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(2) Take the difference in days and annotate such within in the "Admin" module, "GT/Inop/Abatement" tab, sub-tab "GT Restored", "Nbr Days" data field. Also, within the "Reason" data field of "GT Restored" tab, annotate "variable rate increase".

(3) Within in the "Effective Date" data field contained within the "GT Restored" tab, annotate "2010-01-21" (date of directive memorandum, reference (a)).

c. Each affected record shall be reviewed to ensure the 13 days GCT/Earned Time (ET) per month maximum is not exceeded per article 9201.2f(3) of reference (d).

(1) Any additional days of ET over the 13 days per month maximum can be managed by annotating an entry within the "Admin" module, "GT/Inop/Abatement" tab, sub-tab "ET Forfeited", "Nbr Days" data field. In the "Reason" data field enter "exceeded variable rate".

(2) Ensure an entry for each month the 13 days were exceeded are annotated per above. Each forfeiture entry needs to coincide with each month and year ET was exceeded.
